PARENTHETICAL SideBySide →(sweetly droll) Parenthetical Wanna go shopping at ALT + I. tomorrow, pal? SIDE-BY-KATE **JACK** SIDE What? Do we really have to? (even louder) DIALOGUE Couldn't we stay in C'mon now, Jack--you can't **TABLE** go back on your promise! (SEE HELP) Kate begins to mercilessly PUMMEL Jack, which he enjoys immensely.
